

Impact of Proposed Rule to Eliminate D/S

- Students in F-1 status are admitted with D/S ("Duration of Status"). Students may remain lawfully in the US as long their I-20s are valid.
- There is no set limit on how long the student may be admitted into the US.
- UCR can easily and quickly extend a student's I-20 (F-1 status) if more time is needed to complete an academic program. Dependent status (F-2) is automatically extended with the F-1 status.
- Students have a 60-day Grace Period after completion of their academic program or employment authorization (OPT).



Changes if D/S is Eliminated

- Students in F-1 status will be admitted for the length of the academic program <u>not to</u> <u>exceed four years</u>.
- Students from State Sponsor of Terrorism List and students from countries with an overstay rate greater than 10% will be admitted for a maximum of <u>two years</u>.
- Students attending schools not fully participating in E-Verify will be admitted for a maximum of two years. UC does not fully participate in E-Verify.
- Program extensions will be approved by USCIS. Extensions for F-2 dependents are not automatically granted when the F-1 extension is approved and must be applied for separately.
- Students applying for OPT will also have to apply for an extension.
- Grace Period is shortened to 30 days.





- UCR students will need to apply for extensions every two years.
 - Application fees.
 - Lengthy processing times.
 - Uncertainty about supporting documentation wanted by USCIS.
 - Higher risk of denial.
- UCR students may not be allowed to remain in US to complete academic program if extension is denied.
- Studying in the US will become more complicated and expensive for students.



Ongoing university efforts and resources

- UCOP working on comments. Some universities ask faculty to provide comments directly. After consultations, we do no see benefits of individual comments. <u>UCOP issued</u> <u>a letter to DHS</u>.
